- In accordance with California dual enrollment policies, TIDE Academy students may earn a different grade in the high school course than the college course during the same term. College classes taken via concurrent enrollment are NOT weighted.
- Students are permitted to drop dual-enrollment classes in accordance with Foothill College enrollment policies.
- TIDE Academy offers no honors courses, and only AP Physics 2 and AP Calculus AB in addition to dual enrollment.
- TIDE Academy does not offer School Day SAT/ACT options and nearby open test sites continue to be in short supply.
- Many teacher recommendations are provided by teachers in elective areas that are served by dual-enrollment coursework.
- COVID Statement: Pass/No Pass grading was required by the district for all students in the spring of 2020. Emergency learning from March-June 2020. Distance learning from August 2020-March 2021. Hybrid learning from April-June 2021. Per California law, grades from 2020-21 may be changed to P/NP.
